The Swiss Forum for International Agricultural Research (SFIAR) offers an annual Award for graduates and scientists working in agricultural research for development.

This years' Team Award goes to MeteoSwiss, SENAMHI Peru, SDC, WMO and other partners for their project "Climandes – User-tailored Climate Services for the Andean Region". The Master Thesis Award goes to Sebastian Mengel of BFH-HAFL for his research on agricultural livelihoods of rural youth in the drylands of Midelt, Morocco.

Event

At this event the two awarded research projects will be presented and set into a wider context. Climandes involves Andean farmers in the development of high-quality climate services. Sebastian Mengel aims to understand realities and aspirations of rural youth as a precondition to effectively engage them in agriculture. So, both projects involve the rural population and their opinions and needs. This is important but can be challenging. Farmers are often meant to be the beneficiaries of research, while their voices and engagement in research planning and implementation are often limited. How can they become important actors in agricultural research for development? The event aims to debate on this issue and provide some practical examples.
